Who is Wright's Adult Education Program?

Our mission is to provide educational programs that help adults become literate, learn English as a second language, obtain a GED or HiSET credential, and gain the knowledge, skills and guidance necessary to transition to college and career pathways. At Wright we have 21 people on staff, 75 Adult Educators, and over 3,000 students.

What is Wright's Adult Education Program?

We offer FREE English as a Second Language (ESL), Language Arts and Math GED prep classes in English and Spanish (ABE/ASE), Computer Skills courses, and Healthcare and IT Bridge programs. This Fall we have 274 class sections.

When is Wright's Adult Education Program?

We offer classes in the AM and PM during the week and on Saturdays. Fall II begins the week of October 17, 2016. The spring term begins the week of January 9th, 2017.

Where is Wright's Adult Education Program?

We offer classes at the Main Campus, Humboldt Park and at over 20 locations throughout the community. You can come see us in the Arts Building Rm 205 or at Humboldt Park Rm 302.
